- The successful applicant/s will receive a one year school membership of AASE (SA Chapter)
- Each grant will be awarded to an educational professional working in the field of disability in one of the schooling sectors
- The grant may be used to purchase resources (including equipment and personnel) that are not available through regular school or system funding allocations
- All applicants must complete the application form and abide by the conditions of the grant as indicated
- Applications will be processed by the Australian Association of Special Education (SA Chapter). The decision of this committee will be final.
